From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to those parents and carers who were able to attend the Parent Information Evenings. Our parent information sessions were well attended and demonstrate the importance that you as parents have on working together in educating your child.

I spoke to all classes about Holy Spirit Primary having beautiful facilities, supportive families and great teachers. Thank you for taking the time to visit the school and hear about the plans each of the teachers have for your children.

A reminder of some key points:

Uniform

Children are to wear correct school uniform including school hat each day. Children are not to colour their hair or to have streaks, foils, etc. Radical or exaggerated haircuts and hairstyles are not permitted.

Be Punctual

The start of the school day is key learning time. To set your child up for success children need to arrive at school on time, line up with their class and be ready for a day of learning. Duty at school begins at 8:20am. Children who arrive at school before 8:20am are unsupervised.

Help children to be independent

Remember to speak positively to your children about school. Avoid comments such as 'what am I going to do without you?' and 'I'm going to be lonely without you'. Such comments can be unsettling for children. Rather say something like 'can't wait to hear what you played at school'.

Reading

Children need to practice essential skills. It is important that they practice reading every night. Sometimes you might share the reading with your child. Try to make the experience fun and something they look forward to.

Please join us fortnightly of a Friday at 3pm for prayer in the classrooms.

Toilets

Parents, carers and visitors for child protection please do not use the children's toilets. If you need to use the facilities please ask at the school office.

Learning Matters

Dear Parents,

As parents you are very influential in the life of your child. There are certain "life skills" which you have been teaching your children from an early age. These may include; a hygiene routine, making sure to brush teeth and tidy hair, general safety around the home and during play and road safety.

You play an important role in keeping your child/children safe as they travel to and from school. These safety rules need to be taught and modelled by parents. Parents can actively teach road safety behaviours and explain why they are safe. As with all new skills which are learnt it is a great idea to praise and encourage your child during these times.

The following tips are issued by the NRMA.

Travelling by car.

Ensure your child is using the correct child restraint for their age for every trip.

Teach your child to enter and exit using the rear door nearest the footpath called the "safety" door.

Never call your child across the road, instead meet them at the school gate.

Catching a bus.

Take and pick your child up from the bus stop.

Help your child get on and off the bus.

Remind children to be polite on the bus and listen to the bus driver's instructions.

Wait for the bus to move on before crossing the road with your child.

Walking to School.

Model how to *Stop*, *Look*, *Listen and Think* when crossing the road.

Hold hands with smaller children when crossing the road, on a footpath or in a car park.

Teach your child the safest places to cross the road. (Use the Moore Street Crossing)

School Pick-up and Drop-off zones.

Be patient, be alert to children around your car, and follow the school rules.

Do not use the parish driveway as a turning bay.

Never double park or make illegal U-turns.

Riding a Bike

Check your child's helmet is correctly fitted.

Always supervise your child, especially near driveways and cars.

Regularly check the bike's brakes and steering.

Religious Matters

Ash Wednesday

The liturgical season of Lent begins on Wednesday 5 March when Christians come together for a special day of reflection known as Ash Wednesday.

The children will be involved in a liturgy to be held in the MPA where they will receive a cross of ashes on their forehead. This cross reminds them that Lent has been set aside by the church as a time when we try to grow more like Jesus and turn away from selfish and destructive habits which impact negatively on our relationships with others and with God.

Ash Wednesday begins the forty days of Lent which concludes with the joyous celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday. Lent is a time for inner reflection to examine those areas of our lives where we know we could improve so that we might come closer to realising our potential to be the people we were created to be; signs of God's love in the world.

The liturgies for Ash Wednesday will be times of quiet prayer and reflection for the children, but if you are in, or around the school at the time, please know that you are welcome to join us. Years 3-6-11.30am and Years K-2-12.00pm in the MPA.


