Apologies regarding the information in our last newsletter. Families are encouraged to holiday or travel during school vacations. Learning Matters

Last week many parents attended the Parent Information Evening. Just you being there is saying so much to your children. You're saying that you are interested in their education, you want them to succeed and you are there to help them and support them and that education and learning are important to you. This positive attitude is contagious and your child will bring this positive attitude to their learning community.

A positive attitude acts as a motivation for the students, is a very important part in the learning cycle and is a contributing factor in achievement and school. Teachers use strategies to increase motivation and develop positive attitudes in the classroom.

Mrs Hines and I have been visiting the classroom and seeing these strategies at work. Teachers are constantly giving praise and acknowledgement of achievement. Children know exactly what they need to do in each lesson because the "Success Criteria" is discussed at the beginning of a session and visible to the class. There's no guesswork involved. The children know that if they want to be successful they need to check the requirements stated in the Success Criteria and aim to complete them. Children are constantly praised for their efforts and small and large steps are celebrated.

The learning community must have an attitude where if mistakes are made they must be seen as an opportunity from which to learn. Children need to have confidence in themselves to be able to have a go in the knowledge that if they don't get it right first time, or even second, no one will laugh at them and someone will be there to give them direction and support. That doesn't change as you get older. Throughout our lives we travel the learning curve, hopefully with people around us who will offer support and encouragement.

Ash Wednesday

The liturgical season of Lent begins on Wednesday 18 February when Christians come together for a special day of reflection known as Ash Wednesday.

The children will be involved in a liturgy to be held in the MPA where they will receive a cross of ashes on their forehead. This cross reminds them that Lent has been set aside by the church as a time when we try to grow more like Jesus and turn away from selfish and destructive habits which impact negatively on our relationships with others and with God.

Ash Wednesday begins the forty days of Lent which concludes with the joyous celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday. Lent is a time for inner reflection to examine those areas of our lives where we know we could improve so that we might come closer to realising our potential to be the people we were created to be; signs of God's love in the world.
