Learning Matters

During the last week many parents attended the Parent Information Evening. Just you being there sends positive messages to your children. You're saying that you are interested in their education, you want them to succeed and you are there to help them and support them and that education and learning are important to you. This positive attitude is contagious and your child will bring this mindset to their learning community.

A positive attitude acts as a motivation for the students, is a very important part in the learning cycle and is a contributing factor in achievement and school. Teachers use strategies to increase motivation and develop positive attitudes in the classroom.

Mrs Hines and I have been visiting the classrooms and seeing these strategies at work. Teachers are constantly giving praise and acknowledgement of achievement. Children know exactly what they need to do in each lesson because the "Success Criteria" is discussed at the beginning of a session and visible to the class. Success Criteria are statements that describe what success looks like when the learning goal is reached. They are specific, concrete and measureable. There's no guesswork involved. The children know that if they want to be successful they need to check the requirements stated in the Success Criteria and aim to complete them. Children are constantly praised for their efforts and small and large steps are celebrated.

The learning community must have an attitude where if mistakes are made they must be seen as an opportunity from which to learn. Children need to have confidence in themselves to be able to have a go in the knowledge that if they don't get it right first time, or even second, no one will laugh at them and someone will be there to give them direction and support. That doesn't change as you get older. Throughout our lives we travel the learning curve, hopefully with people around us who will offer support and encouragement.
