Dear Parents and Carers,

A vital life skill is the ability to speak about emotional issues rather than bottle up feelings or lash out at others.

Children need the space and vocabulary to talk about their feelings. They sometimes need assistance to find the words to describe their feelings. Sometimes it helps to write down or even draw how they are feeling.

Children need to understand that all sorts of feelings are acceptable and can be spoken about but not all behaviours are permissible. It is okay to be angry but it is nor ok to hit a sibling or act destructively. They need to learn that their feelings are not the problem but some actions are.

It helps when parents model healthy ways of dealing with feelings and create a safe environment so children are more likely to talk freely and seek help about those feelings that may be troubling them.

Attendance

It is important that children continue to attend school each day to maximise their learning. Cumulative absences can cause gaps in student's learning as well as emotional anxiety.

Assistant Principal

Sometimes helping your child with their Homework activities may be a little daunting if you don't feel comfortable with the particular task. Writing may be one such activity.

You don't have to be an expert to help your child with their writing. It may help to share your own writing experiences, explaining why you are writing and to whom you are writing. This is called the **purpose** and the **audience**. It makes sense when you consider that as adults we nearly always write with an intention and to someone. At school, the teachers model writing that has purpose and an audience. They also focus on the "surface features' of the writing which includes the use of capital letters and other forms of punctuation. These aspects of writing are detailed in the NSW English Curriculum and is available online.

It is important that children understand who they are writing for and why they are writing, as this determines the tone and form that a piece of writing takes. For example, a note from a parent to a child reminding him or her to do a job on arriving home will have quite a different form and tone from a letter to a grandparent inviting her to join a family celebration.


How can I encourage my child to write?

- Read your child's writing or have him or her read the writing to you, and make positive comments.
- Praise your child for having a go at writing words that are new and explain how to spell harder words.
- Talk to your child about why an author might create a book, play or film in a particular way. What ideas or opinions are presented? What is the author's purpose?
- Read and talk about the writing that your child brings home from school.
- Praise your child for using neat and legible handwriting.
- In order to develop spelling and vocabulary, play word games such as I Spy, Scrabble, Boggle, Scattergories and crosswords.

When exercise books come home at the end of the year, spend some time looking at the content and notice the growth your child has made since the beginning of the school year. If you are anything like me there will be some pieces of writing that you won't be able to put into the recycling bin. I have kept so many pieces of my children's writing and cannot throw them away.

Below is some writing that my daughter wrote in Kindy explaining why she should not be sleeping. Definitely **purpose** and **audience**, though I still can't decipher all of it!
