### Learning Matters

The beginning of this year has been busy as we have all settled back into routine.

Kiss'n'Ride is a convenient and relatively safe way to drop off and pick up your children.

So ensure that traffic flows safely we ask you to follow the Kiss'n'Ride rules.

- 1. Do not park across the parish driveway. The driveways are marked with yellow paint
- 2. Be aware of the time constraints outlined on the sign posts
- 3. Do not park your car in the Kiss'n'Ride zone
- 4. Please stay in your car and allow children to get in on the kerbside

We realise that the safety of your children is utmost in your minds as you drop them off to school. It is possible to watch them enter the school grounds if you move past the parish driveway.

The other point that needs to be mentioned is the number of parents driving into a neighbour's driveway and then completing a 3-point turn. It is very difficult to have clear vision when cars are parked up and down Todd Row. We encourage you to enter from the Melville Rd end of Todd Row. That way you can safely drop your children at the school gate without trying to manage a three-point turn and stopping the flow of traffic while you do this.

Please keep these points in mind when next you drop your children off to school or pick them up again in the afternoon. As mentioned previously, the safety of the whole community is our main priority.

### **Moore Street Holy Spirit Primary School** Student pick-up guide Walk in to pick up children Do not from the soft fall play area park in 'No Takes only Stopping' 4 minutes!! zones 1. Afternoon: Queue from the beginning of the "pick-up" zone for under 2 minutes only. 2. Queue behind the first car. DO NOT jump ahead in the queue. Teachers escort children to the car. All bags go into the car. Children enter cars on the kerb side. In the morning, please drop off children at the southern school gate. 3. If your family takes a long time to get into the car, please wait until after the rush before joining the queue. Some families have lots of children to load into the car or have to buckle in young children. The children will sit and wait quite happily with their friends. 4. The end of the pick-up zone: The last car in the queue must be within the 'No Parking' zone. 5. DO NOT double park on Todd Row if the queue is full when you arrive. It is illegal to block traffic If the queue is full, please drive on and either park legally when it is possible to drive on. and pick up your child or wait 5 minutes and try again.

### Sports Update

#### Feedback from the Primary Sport Gala Days Survey

Thank you to all the families who returned the Primary Sport Gala Day Survey at the end of last year. Each year in early February, all primary schools must nominate which Gala Days they will participate in, and the number of teams they wish to enter to the **Parramatta Diocese Catholic Primary School Sports Council.** 

Therefore, the data we collect in term 4 provides us with this necessary information.

We received the following forms, which were tallied by a parent representative and myself: In Year 3 & 4 we have **108 students** and we received **61** responses In Year 5 & 6 we have **103 students** and we received **41** responses (NB: Late forms were also added to the initial count)

We have to make decisions based on the information you supply, and the limited responses we received, makes this an extremely difficult process.

Why do some sports have restrictions that require students to have played 'on the weekend'? In short, it's all about safety.

### Rugby League:

- students need to play this sport on the weekend (with at least 1 year of playing experience in the previous year) because they need to know how to tackle and be tackled
- they also need to have football boots and mouthguards

#### Soccer:

students must have soccer boots and shin pads

Therefore, we are following the **Parramatta Diocese Catholic Primary School Sports Council** requirements.

#### Why was my child not chosen?

There are a number of reasons why students are not chosen for a sporting team. The most common reasons are:

- we only have enough students to field 1 team & your child was not one of the strongest players
- they did not turn up for the trials
- they are ineligible to be selected due to unacceptable classroom or playground behaviour or attendance (parents will be consulted regarding this situation)

If you have any further questions regarding sport at Holy Spirit, please see me, or request that this be added to the agenda for discussion at the next School Committee Meeting.

We invite all parents; older siblings and grandparents to consider volunteering to assist us at our sporting events this year (eg: timing at carnivals, assisting with the coaching of school teams, umpiring at Gala Days, etc...) Please contact the school office and leave your details regarding your availability and area/s of interest.

*Please note:* that it is a requirement that all volunteers commencing work in our school complete child protection training. This training is completed online. A notification of your successful completion of the module will be sent via e-mail to the school. Please find link below:
