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From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Many children have fears that surface at various times in their lives. Sometimes fears are triggered by an event or an unfortunate accident. Children can also learn fears from adults e.g. fearing a trip to the dentist because they have overheard their parents own fears.

Parents can help their children deal with fears. Some suggestions include:

- Distinguish between caution and fear. Caution is the recognition of possible dangers and consideration of ways of dealing with them safely. Fear can be debilitating and diminish the ability to cope.
- Investigate the source of the fear by listening to your child. Show them you understand how they feel and give them permission to express their feelings.
- Reassure them by telling them the truth. Ensure there are as few changes as possible in their lives following a trauma.
- Teach them some skills to cope, give them ideas on how they might beat their fears.
- View the positive side of events and show your faith in their ability to cope. Just as children pick up on parental anxiety they also learn optimism from their parents.

Being able to read is an essential skill in the development of each child. It has always been a focus at Holy Spirit and we encourage parents to promote the benefits of reading at home.

Below is a list of six elements of instruction that every child should experience every day:

- Every child reads something he or she chooses
- Every child reads accurately
- Every child reads something he or she understands
- Every child writes about something personally meaningful
- Every child talks with peers about reading and writing
- · Every child listens to a fluent adult read aloud

These points are covered during our Literacy blocks at school, but as always we ask parents to ensure that children are reading at home as well.

Reading should also continue during the holidays. Children could read different sorts of text other than the readers that are sent home during the term. Non-fiction books from the library, children's magazines, suitable articles or stories from the Internet and for the older children ... the newspaper.

Keep reading and writing and keep learning!







This book is amazing for little children and I assure you they will go to sleep on time, dreaming about monsters.






Fees
