Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to term 3, I hope you had an enjoyable holiday break. The children have come back refreshed with some wonderful memories of their holidays.

Mornings are often chaotic. Both parents and children have a great deal to prepare for the day. Attention-seekers and dawdlers often find mornings an ideal time to keep parents busy. Many morning difficulties arise due to a lack of clear understanding of the roles to be performed. Most children are capable of doing their morning tasks without parental interference.

- Establish a clear routine. With your children's help work out an order of activities that everyone understands.
- Identify the jobs that children should be able to do routinely that directly involve them e.g. getting their cereal, putting their plates in sink or dishwasher, dressing for school and packing school bags.
- Be aware of possible distractions and minimise them e.g. TV. Television if it is to be watched can be turned on when children are dressed and ready for school. Uniforms can be laid out the night before to prevent children dawdling over finding their clothes.








Just a reminder if your child is participating in the Premier Reading Challenge their reading logs are due to be entered online by Friday 25 August.
